Rising 76 stories above the dynamic cityscape of Seattle, the Columbia Center Tower hosts this exhilarating, consistently sold-out event, providing an opportunity for these firefighters to test themselves on the 69-flight event course, using air-packs, carrying 50+ pounds of gear in support of the LLS mission. Showing big heart, these fundraisers conquer 1,356 steps and 788 feet of vertical elevation to reach the top, beat their personal best, and fulfill our motto: **Climb. Conquer. Cure.**

Some quick facts:

- Leukemia causes more deaths than any other cancer among children and young adults under the age of 20.
- Every 3 minutes someone is diagnosed with blood cancer and every 9 minutes someone loses their life to this terrible disease.
- Firefighters are three times more likely to receive a blood cancer diagnosis than the average person due to their increased exposure to carcinogens.
